



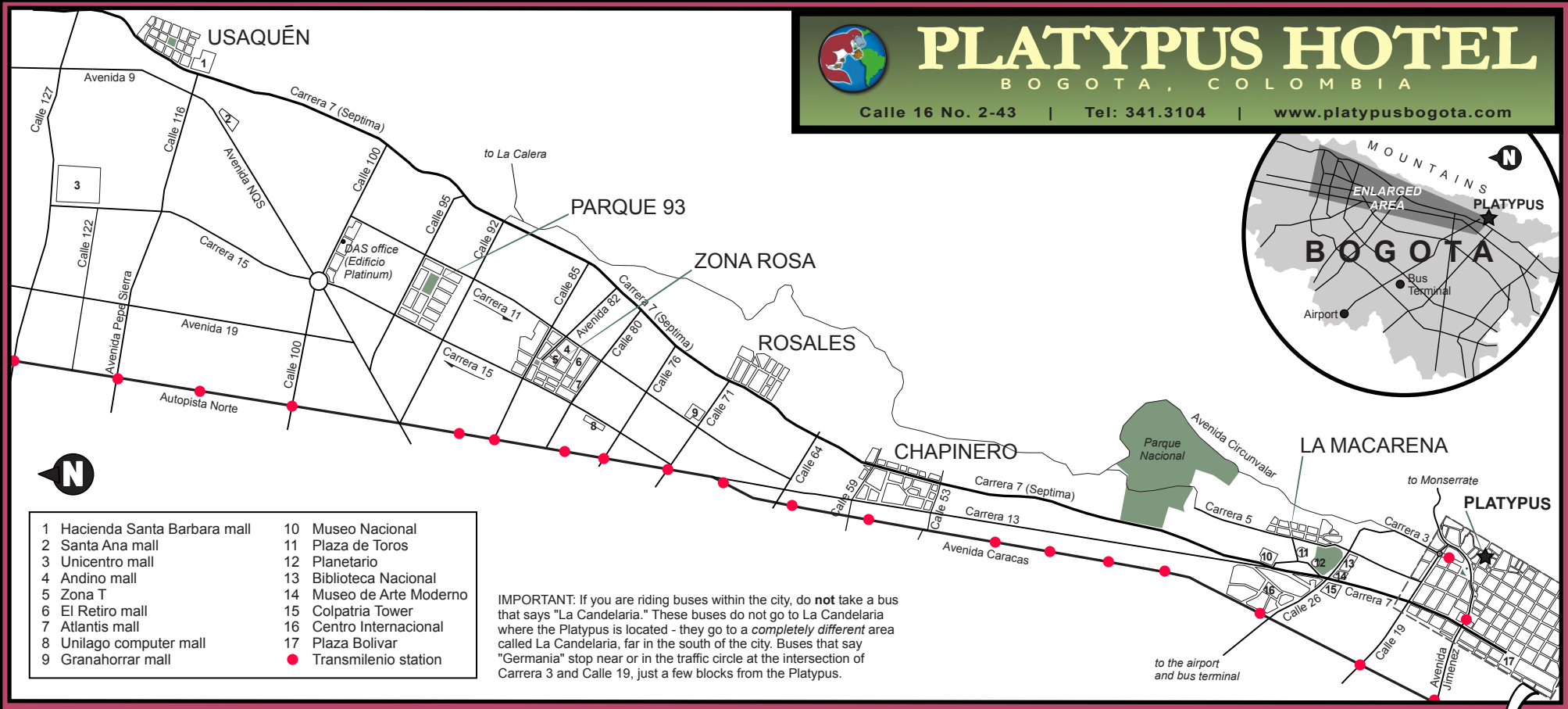

IMPORTANT: If you are riding buses within the city, do **not** take a bus that says "La Candelaria." These buses do not go to La Candelaria where the Platypus is located - they go to a *completely different* area called La Candelaria, far in the south of the city. Buses that say "Germania" stop near or in the traffic circle at the intersection of Carrera 3 and Calle 19, just a few blocks from the Platypus.

A FEW THINGS THAT MAY BE GOOD TO KNOW

Buses for the bus terminal and the airport can be found on Calle 19.
 Buses and taxis going north can be found on Carrera Septima.
 To leave Bogotá on a bus going north (for example, to Villa de Leyva), buses can also be found by taking the Transmilenio to the furthest point north (Portal del Norte station). Buses line up both inside the Portal del Norte station and outside along the street in front of the Exito store.
 Taxis in Bogotá have meters and rate cards. Some taxis have meters that show you the price, but other taxis only show you a number that corresponds with a price on a laminated rate card. Note that there are extra charges for nighttime, Sundays, holidays, the airport, etc. These extra charges are listed at the bottom of the rate card.
 Carreras run north-south. The abbreviation is "cra."
 Calles run east-west. The abbreviation is "cle."
 For example, an address like "Cra 15 #84-12" is on Carrera 15. Calle 84 is the lower cross-street, and 12 is the building on the block between Calle 84 and 85.
 The neighborhood above Carrera 1, uphill from La Candelaria, is called Egipcio. South of Calle 7, past the presidential palace, is called Las Cruces. It's not especially recommendable to go walking in these neighborhoods with your valuables.
