We invite you to explore our many diverse park areas, keyed by number to the map at right:

1 Lower Town Relive 19th-century Harpers Ferry through restored buildings, exhibits, media presentations, and ranger-conduct-ed talks and pro-grams. Allow 3-6 hours

2 Virginius Island Explore the ruins of a once-thriv-ing 19th-century industrial town along the Shenan-doah River. 1-2 hours

3 Camp Hill Visit Harper Cemetery and examine old armory buildings dev-astated by civil war and returned to use as class-rooms for Storer College. 1-2 hours

**4 Murphy Farm** Explore a site where Civil War conflict and Civil Rights freedom come together. *1 hour* 

5 Bolivar Heights Walk in the footsteps of Abra-ham Lincoln and Stone-wall Jackson. This loca-tion also affords a splen-did view of the Harpers Ferry water gap. 1-2 hours

**6 Union Skirmish Line** Site of the final infantry engagement during the 1862 battle. *1 hour* 

**7 Jackson's Right Flank** From this position, Jackson orchestrated move-

ments sealing the fate of the Federals. 1 hour

8 Maryland Heights Hike to discover ruins of Civil War forts and camp-grounds and savor the spectacular views. 3-6 hours

**9 Loudoun Heights** Ascend the Blue Ridge via the historic and scenic Appalachian Trail and relish the splendid mountain vistas. *3-5 hours*
