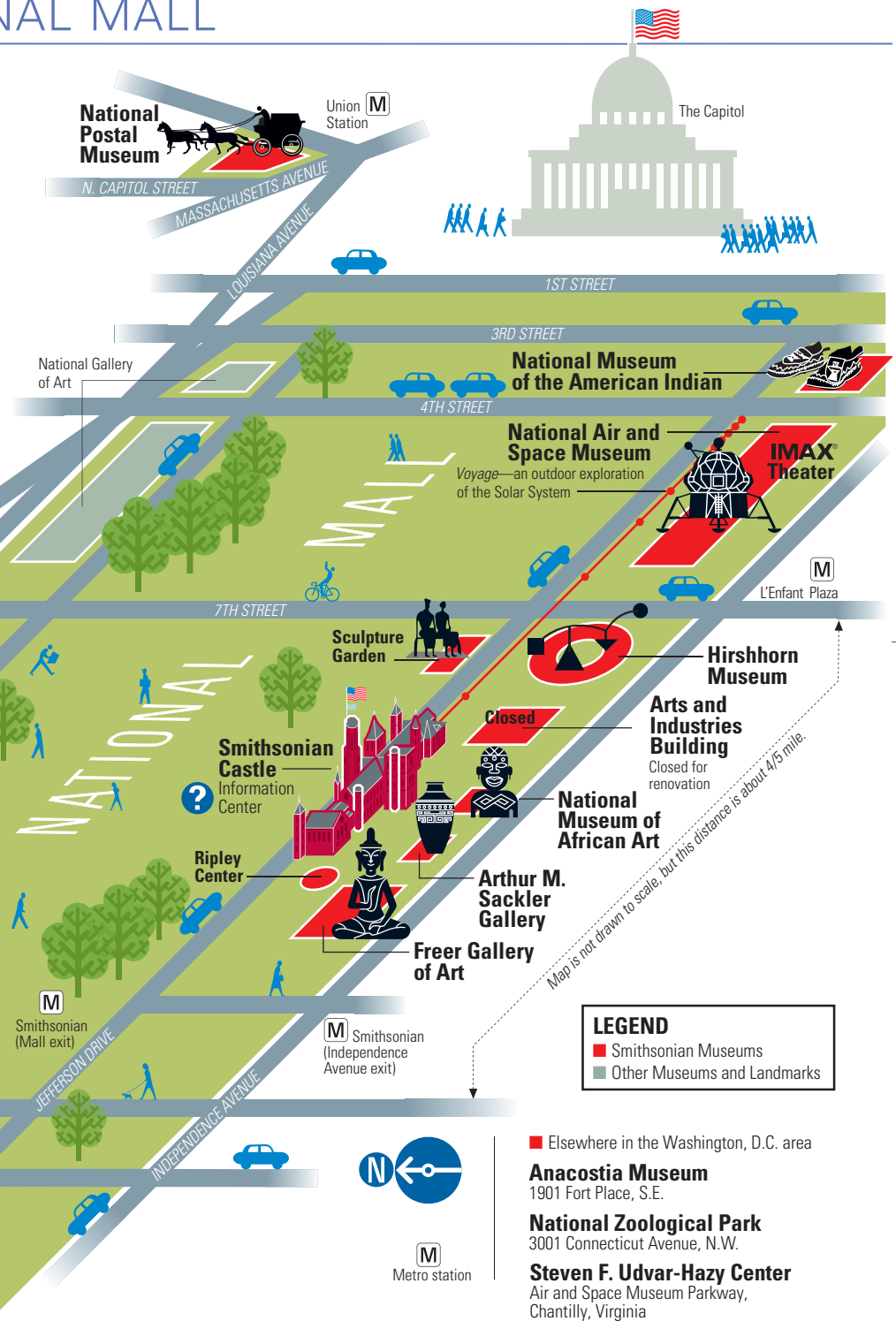
GETTING AROUND THE NATIONAL MALL

■ Sidewalks line the **four main east-west streets: Independence Avenue, Jefferson Drive, Madison Drive, and Constitution Avenue.** Many of the paths running within the grassy area bounded by Jefferson and Madison are gravel. With children in strollers, you may find the sidewalks easier to navigate.

■ On-street **parking is extremely limited**; visitors are encouraged to use public transportation. Call **Metrobus** and **Metro** for information about elevator and escalator outages: (202) 637-7000 or (202) 638-3780 (TTY). Metro information and on-line farecard sales are also available at www.wmata.com.

■ **ATMs:** At each of the following locations there are ATMs accessible to people who are seated or standing: the National Air and Space Museum, the National Museum of American History, the National Museum of Natural History, the National Zoological Park, the National Museum of the American Indian and the Smithsonian Castle.

■ Don't miss **Voyage—A Journey Through Our Solar System** made up of a scale model of our Sun and its planets. It starts with the Sun at the east (4th Street) end of Jefferson Drive near the National Air and Space Museum and ends with Pluto at the Castle.
