LIFEGUARDS: In addition to mobile lifeguards: Summer – towers staffed 10 a.m. – 6 p.m.; Spring/Fall limited tower staffing; Winter (Nov-March) – no towers staffed.

Ask about current conditions/beach safety before you swim!

BE SAFE AT THE BEACH

The ocean can be dangerous at any time of the year and in any location. Every year people drown because they do not understand the dangers posed by the massive power and strength of ocean waters. The most important lesson? Learn to swim (before you go) and never swim alone!

Ocean Safety Tips

- Always keep an eye on the surf—Large rogue waves can hit the shore without warning, crashing much farther up the beach than normal waves. They can knock down both children and adults and drag them into deep water.
- On steep beaches, be wary of backwash—Even normal waves can create a dangerous rush of water that can knock you off your feet and pull you out into the ocean.
- Do not dive headfirst into the surf—Divers may hit hidden rocks or the shallow bottom, resulting in paralysis or death.
- Know what a rip current is and how to free yourself if caught in one.





RIP CURRENTS

A rip current is a channel of water flowing away from shore. Rip currents, which are quite common, will typically form at breaks in sandbars or near structures, such as piers. A rip current can be very narrow or may be more than 50 yards wide. It can quickly increase in speed and therefore may change from moment to moment in terms of the threat posed to swimmers and waders. The average speed of a rip current is one to two feet per second, but some have been found to be as fast as eight feet per second—faster than an Olympic swimmer! As such, a rip current can carry even the strongest swimmer out to sea, sometimes just beyond the line of breaking waves and other times possibly hundreds of yards offshore.

If you find yourself caught in a rip current the first thing to do is stay calm and don't try to fight the current—it will win, not you. Instead, escape the current by swimming in a direction parallel to the shoreline. When you are free of the current, swim away from the rip current and at an angle toward the shore.

PARK FEES are due and payable upon entry into the park. Use the self-registration system if the entrance station is closed. Campsite fee covers one vehicle. Extra vehicle fees are collected upon arrival.

OCCUPANCY: Only eight people and three vehicles per site. No equipment in the planted areas please.

VEHICLE PARKING: Vehicles must be parked in assigned campsite; Not on the roadway, in the planted area or beyond the campsite number. Only 3 licensed vehicles (includes motor cycles/trailers/RVs) are allowed per campsite.

CHECK-OUT TIME is 12PM (noon). Please leave site clean and on time. Check-in time is 2 p.m. Sorry, no exceptions.

RE-REGISTRATION: If you want to reregister, you must contact the entrance station before 9 a.m. the morning you are due out. Re-registration is not guaranteed.

HOOK-UP SITES: Not available

SPEED LIMIT: The speed limit is 15 mph. Use good judgment. Children at play!

DOGS: Must be kept on a leash no longer than six feet and under physical control at all times. They are not permitted on the beach.



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Dogs must be confined to a vehicle or tent at night. Noisy/vicious animals are not allowed. Please clean up after your animal.

CAMPING RESERVATIONS: You may make camping reservations by calling (800) 444-7275 (TTY 800-274-7275). To make online reservations, visit our website at www.parks.ca.gov. CAMP STORE: Open April through October; firewood, ice, groceries.

FIRES AND FIREWOOD: Fires are allowed only in established fire rings. NO beach fires. Do not leave campfires unattended. All plants are protected. Do not cut or attach items to plants.

GENERATORS: Generators must be off from 8 p.m until 10 a.m.

QUIET HOURS are from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. To ensure an enjoyable experience for everyone, please do not disturb other campers, regardless of the time of day or night.

NOISE: Radios and other sound-producing devices must not be audible beyond your immediate campsite, regardless of the time of day or night.

VISITORS: Non-registered guests must exit by 10 p.m. (Quiet hours)

CURFEW: All visitors under the age of 18 must be in their campsites between 10 p.m. – 6 a.m.

ALCOHOL consumption and glass containers are NOT allowed on the beach or beyond your campsite.

TRUCKS: Passengers may not ride in the beds of pick-up trucks (including those with camper shells). California Vehicle Code laws apply.

THEFT WARNING: Keep your vehicles locked and your valuables out of sight. Report any suspicious activity to the park staff.

BICYCLES are allowed only on paved roads. Bicycle riders under age 18 must wear a helmet. Bicycles ridden after dark must have a light. Please ride safely.

MOTORIZED SCOOTERS: Operators must be 16 years of age. Helmets are required. (California Vehicle Code 21235)

INTERPRETIVE PROGRAMS: Ask staff about upcoming programs.

GARBAGE: Household garbage only. Please take vour large items (chairs, carpet, boxes, etc.) home.

RECYCLE: Recycle bins provided for your aluminum cans and plastic bottles. Recycling proceeds supports the Junior Ranger programs!

SQUIRRELS: Don't feed them. Feeding promotes disease, overpopulation and property damage.

WI-FI Service: South Carlsbad State Beach now offers Wi-Fi service.

This service enables park visitors with wireless enabled laptop computers or personal digital assistants (PDAs) to access the Internet. You can access this service if you are within a 150 foot range of the campground office located in the Park.

NO SUBSTANCE (Comet, Ajax, diatomaceous earth, etc.) may be scattered on the ground. "It is a misdemeanor to disperse or otherwise apply any pesticide within any unit or portion thereof, whether to the air, water, ground or vegetation." (California Code of Regulations 4330)

ACCESSIBILITY: California State Parks does not discriminate against individuals with disabilities. All restrooms/shower buildings have accessible facilities. Prior to arrival, visitors with disabilities who need assistance should contact the unit Supervising Ranger at (760) 438-3134.

HANDICAP ACCESSIBLE campsites are sites 16, 77, 87, 97, 108, 119, 126, 148, 153, 184. Restroom/ shower buildings have accessible facilities. Prior to arrival, if you need assistance call (760) 438-3143.


